# Message from the President





The Institute for Far Eastern Studies (IFES) at Kyungnam University was established on September 1, 1972, in conjunction with the issuance of the historic July 4 South-North Joint Communiqué, marking its commitment to contributing to the peaceful unification of the Korean Peninsula. Over the past fifty years, despite challenges inherent in studying North Korea and unification within the Cold War framework, the IFES has consistently achieved significant milestones, underpinned by a deep understanding of the Korean Peninsula and Northeast Asian issues

Currently, we find ourselves amid a historic transformation. New crises emerging beyond traditional military and security concerns, spanning climate, food, energy, and technology, alongside a rapid reshaping of the global supply chain, and a downturn in the global economy have precipitated a significant reconfiguration of the international order. Amid intensifying strategic competition between the United States and China, North Korea is advancing its nuclear and missile capabilities and strengthening ties with China and Russia, and the prolonged Russian–Ukrainian conflict and the Israel–Hamas conflict further contribute to the heightened tension in the international landscape.

In the midst of these transformative shifts, the Institute for Far Eastern Studies at Kyungnam University, leveraging the research accomplishments of the past half-century, will persist in its efforts to spearhead research on peace and unification on the Korean Peninsula and nurture Korean Peninsula experts both domestically and internationally while expanding its research infrastructure. 

#### **International Conferences**

Since the 1970s, even in the midst of the challenging Cold War era, the Institute for Far Eastern Studies at Kyungnam University has been at the forefront of hosting international conferences spanning a wide spectrum of topics. The institute has held a total of 200 international conferences, delving into various topics, including the establishment of peace on the Korean Peninsula and unification, by actively expanding exchanges with scholars, experts, and organizations not only from the United States, China, Japan, and Russia but also from around the world, which have laid a solid foundation for fostering international academic exchange and research.

#### Conferences / Seminars

In addition to actively hosting international conferences, the IFES has collaborated with domestic universities, media organizations, and public institutions to present research and policy alternatives on North Korea and unification issues. Through a variety of channels, including forums, seminars, workshops, academies, and polls, the IFES has assiduously worked to raise awareness about current issues on the Korean Peninsula and to explore and propose effective plans and policy options.



#### **Unification Strategy Forum**

Launched in 1995, the Unification Strategy Forum was established to evaluate unification, foreign affairs, and security policies and propose viable alternatives. Since its inception, former and current officials, as well as academic experts, have engaged in discussions on key issues, deliberating on policy alternatives and charting the course forward for inter-Korean relations.

#### ASIAN PERSPECTIVE (Inaugural publication in 1977)


Launched in 1997. Asian Perspective emerged as an academic journal focused on the political. economic social and cultural affairs of Northeast Asia

In 1995, it entered into a co-publication agreement with Portland State University and in 1998 was named the best international academic journal in the social sciences by the Korea Research Foundation (now the National



Research Foundation of Korea). In 2008, the journal achieved world-class status by securing a place on the Social Science Citation Index (SSCI). Since 2019, it has been published in collaboration with the prestigious Johns Hopkins University Press.

#### KOREA AND WORLD POLITICS (Inaugural publication in 1985)



A professional academic journal specializing in the internal and external politics of North and South Korea, affairs in the periphery of the Korean Peninsula and unification strategy, and the political economy, diplomacy, and security of the United States, China, Russia, Japan, and other Asian countries

It has demonstrated consistent qualitative progress, earning recognition as a listed journal by the National Research Foundation of Korea in 2004. In 1999, the Academy of Inter-Korean Economic Cooperation was founded with the aim of training working-level professionals for the forthcoming era of extensive inter-Korean exchange and cooperation. Recognizing shifts in inter-Korean relations and the evolving internal and external landscape, the academy was expanded to become the Academy of Korean Unification Economy in 2013.

In 2023, the IFES North Korea Nuclear Academy was launched with the aim of deepening understanding of North Korea's nuclear program and offering training to cultivate non-governmental experts in the field.

Annually, Field Training on Unification and Hanma Unification Leadership is held for Kyungnam students to enhance their understanding of North Korea's social and economic situation and overall inter-Korean relations, These programs include various activities such as special lectures by experts, viewing North Korean videos, talk concerts featuring high-ranking North Korean defectors, and field trips to sites associated with division and unification, aiming to provide university students with the opportunity to elevate their awareness of unification and North Korea.

# Academic Exchange Support Program for North Korean and Unification Studies

Starting in 2020, the Academic Exchange Support Program for North Korean and Unification Studies has actively developed and supported diverse research programs to expand the community of overseas researchers with an objective and comprehensive understanding of the Korean Peninsula, and to identify and foster Korean Peninsula experts overseas

#### **Fellowship**

Lasting around six months, the program extends invitations to researchers with expertise and experience in academia, journalism, and government from overseas to come to Korea to conduct research and cultivate academic networks in the field of North Korea and unification.

By supporting overseas research on North Korea and unification conducted by national institutions, think tanks, and researchers located outside Korea, the IFES aims to foster consensus-building on the Korean Peninsula and issues related to North Korea and unification in other countries while expanding the space for exchanges between domestic and foreign researchers.

# Library

The Institute for Far Eastern Studies at Kyungnam University Library is a specialized library established to facilitate research by offering pertinent information and materials to researchers on unification and North Korea issues, both domestically and internationally.
