o February 5 - Results of an In-Depth Survey of 40 Domestic Experts

- Kyungnam University's Institute for Far Eastern Studies (Director Kwan-Sei Lee) released the results of an in-depth survey conducted among 40 experts on the outlook for the Korean Peninsula under the second Trump administration.
 - The majority of experts predict that "tangible progress in both North-South and U.S.-North Korea relations is unlikely."
 - "Even if the engagement between the U.S. and North Korea is resumed, achieving tangible and visible results will be challenging. As for inter-Korean relations, due to the structural issues, tensions are expected to persist regardless of the U.S.-North Korea relationship, making it necessary to seek a new paradigm for North-South relations."
